OIL COOLER IN THE CUB

Stag Air Park, NC - Since her return to flight Grandma has been plagued with the problem of consistently high oil temperature. The list of inspections, repairs, replacements, and modifications to the engine oil system would fill a textbook. But none have solved the fundamental problem. The only successful reduction in operating oil temperature came with cooler ambient temperatures. But we all recognized that warmer temperatures were only a few months away, and that a more permanent solution would need to be found.

Our club President, and Master Mechanic, Phil Ellison finally concluded that the only way to lower the oil temperature was to install an oil cooler. We had an oil cooler that came with one of the engines that provided the replacement crankshaft, and Phil had been quietly studying the problem for some time. Before Phil and Ron Herrschaft began the actual fabrication of the installation, they decided to pressure check the oil cooler with compressed air before installing it in the airplane. That was a brilliant decision because the replacement oil cooler leaked! Much better to leak air than later leak oil while in flight! So, installation was interrupted while a brand new oil cooler was ordered.

In the meantime, Phil attempted to fashion a plenum

that would connect a round air hose to the rectangular front of the oil cooler. He bent and riveted a plenum that would have worked, but....

Al Meadowcroft studied the home made plenum and put his welding talent to



work. He crafted an aluminum plenum that looks like it was ordered from an aircraft parts store. It only needs a stamped serial number.



With all the necessary parts and hoses at hand the new oil cooler was installed in the space between the fire wall and the engine baffle on the port side of the engine bay. (That's the left side for you land lubbers.) On the Monday morning after the Christmas Party, Phil tested the new oil cooler system during a 1.8 hour flight. He was very happy to report that the oil temperature did not go above 190 degrees during the entire flight.

Well done to all who contributed to this effort! And especially to Phil Ellison for his persistence and engineering expertise that has finally solved the problem.
